



## Hanwha Aerospace Launches Industrial Cooperation Kick-off with Norwegian Industry Following Chunmoo Contract

- *Kick-off meetings held with Andøya Space, Nammo, Akkodis and other Norwegian partners from 7–9 April*
- *Hanwha Aerospace reaffirms commitment to meaningful industrial cooperation beyond contract delivery*

**Apr 13, 2026** – Hanwha Aerospace held a series of kick-off meetings with Norwegian defence industry partners last week, as part of its commitment to fulfilling industrial cooperation obligations under the Chunmoo Gungnir multiple rocket launcher system contract with Norway.

The meetings, held from 7 to 9 April in Norway, brought together Hanwha Aerospace representatives and key Norwegian industry partners including Andøya Space, Nammo, Westcontrol, Chemring Nobel, Akkodis, Kitron, as well as T&G. The kick-off sessions were designed to establish structured cooperation frameworks with each partner and to align on technical collaboration plans for the program's implementation phase.

Billy Boowhan Lee, Head of the PGM Business Group at Hanwha Aerospace, said, “Last week’s meetings demonstrate Hanwha Aerospace's firm commitment to building lasting partnerships with Norway's defence industry. Our goal is not only to deliver a world-class capability to the Norwegian Armed Forces, but to ensure meaningful technology cooperation and industrial participation that benefits the Norwegian defence ecosystem.”

The week began with a meeting between Hanwha Aerospace and Andøya Space to discuss program coordination and explore broader cooperation opportunities. This was followed by two days of intensive one-on-one sessions with each partner company, covering key areas such as joint development, co-production frameworks, and supply chain integration and expansion.

Gunnar Jan Olsen, Vice President of Business Development at Andøya Space, said, “We are pleased to have initiated discussions with Hanwha Aerospace and look forward to exploring potential areas of cooperation.”

Kristian Kjærås, Manager of Industrial Cooperation and Strategic Partnership at Nammo, said, “We appreciate the productive discussions with Hanwha Aerospace during these meeting sessions and look forward to developing meaningful partnerships and collaborative projects together.”

The Chunmoo Gungnir system, selected by Norway as its next-generation Long Range Precision Fire System(LRPFS), represents one of the most significant defence cooperation programs between South Korea and Norway. Hanwha Aerospace has identified industrial cooperation as a core pillar of the program, aiming to establish a sustainable partnership model that extends beyond the initial contract scope.

Building on these meetings, Hanwha Aerospace plans to launch initiatives to strengthen the Norwegian defence industry. The company will develop tailored programs to ensure the timely delivery and successful localization of the Chunmoo system.
